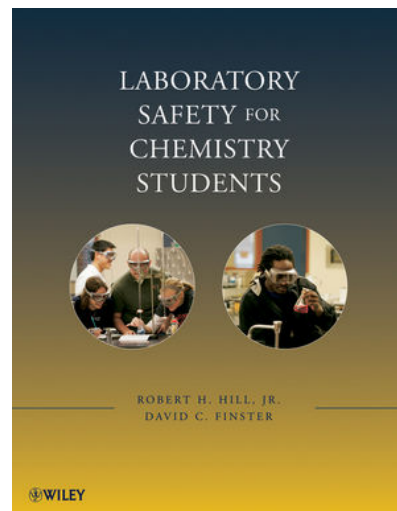


LABORATORY SAFETY TEXTBOOK

The [Laboratory Safety Program](#) in the CHEM Teaching Labs relies on the textbook **LABORATORY SAFETY FOR CHEMISTRY STUDENTS** (LSCS).

The text contains chapters on various aspects of laboratory safety; within each chapter, the material is subdivided into **Introductory**, **Intermediate** and **Advanced** sections. With this progressive approach, the text is designed to be a tool as student can use throughout and beyond a four-year course of study.

- **CHEM 7L & 7LM.** Study the **Introductory** sections (156 pp.) before beginning to work in lab.
- **CHEM 43A** and **CHEM 100A.** Review the Introductory sections and study the **Intermediate** sections (133 pp.) before beginning lab work.
- Students in [advanced lab classes](#) will find materials pertinent to their present and future work, including carcinogens, electric and cryogenic hazards, radiation and laser safety, and biohazards.

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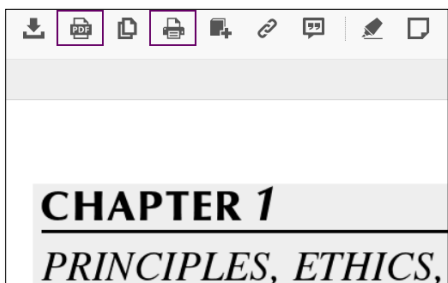
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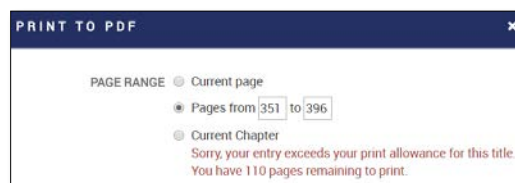
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
